The Plain of Dura was ideal for this purpose because it was spacious and allowed the statue to be clearly seen by the great multitude gathered there.

Daniel 3:1-2

King Nebuchadnezzar made an image of gold, sixty cubits high and six cubits wide, and set it up on the plain of Dura in the province of Babylon.

2 He then summoned the satraps, prefects, governors, advisers, treasurers, judges, magistrates, and all the other provincial officials to come to the dedication of the image he had set up.
